AP Psychology Chapter 14. STUDY. PLAY. Social Psychology. the scientific study of how we think about, influence, and relate to one another. ex: Why do people fall in love. Attribution Theory. the theory that we explain someone's behavior by crediting either the situation or the person's disposition.
