Protests, institutional changes. As a consequence of the student protests and political events in 1968, the Venice Biennale discontinued several of its traditional activities. A period of institutional changes opened, and as a result of the reform process, the Biennale gave itself a new statute in 1973.

The first Biennale, "I Esposizione Internazionale d'Arte della Città di Venezia (1st International Art Exhibition of the City of Venice)" (although originally scheduled for April 22, 1894) was opened on April 30, 1895 by the Italian King and Queen, Umberto I and Margherita di Savoia. The first exhibition was seen by 224,000 visitors.

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
